



## JustREAD Report to the Community 2016-2017

2016-2017 was JustREAD's 12<sup>th</sup> year providing academic support for high school and middle school students in the Mountain View Whisman and Mountain View Los Altos High School Districts. We served more students (179) than we have in any previous single year.

Structured one-on-one tutoring sessions were scheduled on campus during the school day. "Pull-out" sessions were conducted in a separate classroom managed by a JustREAD or JustMATH Site Coordinator. "Push-in" sessions took place inside teachers' classrooms. Sessions began the end of September and early October, and finished the end of May.

For the first time, we also tutored high school students during their 3-week summer school program, providing an additional 45 tutoring sessions to students we worked with during the school year.

There are approximately 1,500 long-term and short-term English Learners in the Mountain View Whisman School District. Many of them are in need of academic assistance and cannot get the help they need at home and cannot afford fee-based tutoring services. JustREAD and JustMATH programs help the students who are struggling the most to develop basic skills, learn to think for themselves, and develop confidence in their own abilities.

### Highlights of the 2016-2017 Academic Year

#### All Programs:

- Total number of students served: 179 (JustREAD 60; JustMATH 119)
- Total number of tutoring sessions provided: 2,356 (JustREAD 1,426; JustMATH 930)
- Total number of high school sessions: 589
- Total number of middle school sessions: 1,767

#### Mountain View High School

##### JustREAD pull-out:

- Total number of JustREAD students: 15
- Total number of JustREAD tutoring sessions: 589
- Students in ELD (English Language Development) classes 1 and 2 were tutored twice per week.
- Students in ELD 3 classes were tutored once per week.
- High school students were new to English, and entered the country this year or last year.
- Some students also received tutoring during summer school.

#### Graham Middle School

##### JustREAD pull-out:

- Total number of JustREAD students: 10
- Total number of JustREAD tutoring sessions: 122
- Students were tutored once per week. These students were pulled from their regular English classes.

##### JustREAD After School

- Total number of JustREAD students: 17
- Total number of JustREAD tutoring sessions: 121
- Tutors worked one-on-one, once per week to support struggling 6<sup>th</sup> grade readers in an after-school English homework club.

**JustMATH pull-out:**

- Total number of JustMATH students: 59
- Total number of JustMATH tutoring sessions: 664
- 7<sup>th</sup> grade students were tutored twice per week.

**Crittenden Middle School**

**JustREAD pull-out**

- Total number of JustREAD students: 18
- Total number of JustREAD tutoring sessions: 594
- 6<sup>th</sup> grade students were tutored twice per week.

**JustMATH push-in**

- Total number of JustMATH students: 60
- Total number of JustMATH tutoring sessions: 266
- Tutors rotated among students in 3 classes (grades 6-8<sup>th</sup> grade).
